The first part focused on gender studies, the second on sexuality studies, and the third on bringing these perspectives together in the analysis of patristic sources. Secondary sources provide the background information needed to engage with the primary sources discussed in class. These secondary sources include not only recent studies of the topics but also historically significant research from the perspective of Western and Eastern Christianities.
